Energy and Mineral Development Program

Each year, the Division of Energy and Mineral Development (DEMD) provides tribes an opportunity to participate in a grant program known as the Energy and Mineral Development Program (EMDP). This program provides financial assistance to tribes and Indian allottees on trust lands in evaluating their energy and mineral resource potential on their lands.

In turn, this provides tribes and allottees with the information they need to promote their lands, negotiate the best agreements with partners or investors, and eventually develop their resources. DEMD solicits proposals from tribes and using a competitive review system selects qualified projects for funding.

Solicitation of grant proposals will be made available through grants.gov on June 9, 2014. Proposals must be submitted by August 25, 2014. The funding opportunity number is BIA-14-FA0001.
